#### \*Reflect

Life keeps us distracted and often times it is hard to pause to reflect on our words & actions. But as they say, "You better check yourself before you wreck yourself!"

It is easy to look around and see everyone else's sins & errors and totally be blind to our own issues. And guess what? We all have issues! If you want to change, you have to look within and identify those things that are residing in your hearts that are not of God.

We often focus on the outside, but neglect the inside. We build an image externally of how we want to be perceived or identified, but internally we are empty, entangled by sin. So we must pause & look within, at the real us to examine our thoughts & motives before our sin takes over.

### \*Use these questions to reflect on your heart daily

Have I been easily offended?
Have I felt overlooked & ignored?
Have I spoken or thought unkindly of anyone?
Am I justifying my words and actions in my mind?
Have I been blaming my circumstances & others?
Have I been impatient and irritable?
Have I been self absorbed, indifferent and
inattentive to people?
Have I avoided people or tasks that I know I
should face?
Have I been anxious and worried?
Have I failed to be self aware or been rash &
impulsive?
Have I been slothful & avoiding things I need to
do?
Am I doing what I do for God's glory and the good
of others or am I being driven by fears, need for
approval, love of comfort and ease, need for control,
hunger for acclaim and power, or the fear of other
people?
Am I looking at anyone with envy?
Am I giving into even the first motion of sexual
lust or gluttony?

#### \*Repent

Only after careful self reflection can we repent of our sins. Because repentance means a genuine change of heart, you have to be willing to open your heart up fully and look within even at those things that scare, hurt and humiliate us.

Once you identity those hidden sins, confess them out loud to God. (If you are comfortable, find an accountability partner to confess your sins as the Book of James teaches us.) As you confess allow the Holy Spirit to break your heart and lead you to a place of deep conviction.

Remember, conviction leads to correction, not condemnation. So don't hate yourself rather hate the sin that separates you from God so much that you turn your affection from that sin to a deep longing for God that cries, "God, I love you more than this!"

#### \* Repeat

God, I thank you for your amazing, unending, saving grace that is available for me. Thank you that nothing can separate me from Your love. God, you see my heart, you know my thoughts and motives. There is no pretending or hiding anything from You. You see the real me. I confess my pride, my anger, my unforgiveness and my need to control. Lord, I ask for forgiveness for worrying instead of trusting, for complaining instead of worshipping, for grumbling instead of being grateful. Break my heart and help me to clearly see the chasm my sin creates between You and me.

Let Your grace remind me that I am a new creation, an image bearer, an overcomer. Because of the blood you shed for me, I am no longer a slave to sin, but I am a child of God. Renew my mind with Your Word and change me from the inside out. Create in me a clean heart, one that chooses Jesus over everything else. And may the meditation of my heart be pleasing to You and let my life bring You glory. In Jesus name!
